Chair Comments:

a) Acting Chair Gunning skipped agenda item 2 until a quorum was formed.

Executive Director Comments:

 a) Patterson reported that the National Council of State Housing Agencies (NCSHA) officially adopted their 2019 legislative priorities during a special Board meeting in December. She added that her NCSHA title changed from President to Board Chair during the same meeting.

- b) CalHFA's role in housing finance reform at the national level will be further enhanced with the appointment of Representative Maxine Waters as the Chair of the Housing Financial Services Committee.
- c) Introduced Francesc Martí as the new Legislative Director of CalHFA.

4. UPDATE ON STATE AND FEDERAL LEGISLATIVE AFFAIRS FOR 2019

Presented by Martí

After giving a brief introduction about his experience, Martí reported to the Board that CalHFA was closely monitoring the federal government shut-down, with special attention focused on Section 8 contracts, secondary market activity with Ginnie Mae, and possible impacts to the multifamily pipeline. He stated CalHFA will be advocating a number of federal priorities in coordination with NCSHA, including Ginnie Mae securitization, tax credit reform, and housing finance reform. He then reported that state legislation introduced to date fell into four general categories: land use, tax credits, redevelopment, and homelessness/tenant protection. Bills to watch include SB50, AB11, and SB18.
